Main Conclusions

The GG TADs member present in the meeting was agreed in the following issues:

- The GF TADs of the Americas is a good mechanism of coordination and co-operation for help and support to the Veterinary Services of the Member Countries to implement their objectives and activities;
- The GF TADs of the Americas is also a good mechanism of cooperation and co-ordination for the International Organizations that work at the Regional Level;
- Despite the formal meeting organizing under the procedures of the HQ of the OIE and FAO, side meeting at regional level will organize in coincidence with Regional event such as: COSALFA, Regional OIE Conferences and OIE General Session;
- Also electronic video conference will be organized;
- The FAO representative expressed concern that he did not know in advance the report on the activities of GF TADs that was submitted to the GF TADs Global Meeting in Paris. In this regard, it was clarified that the notification was received by Part of the GF TADs Global Secretariat, only 10 days in advance and this report was discussed only with the GF TADs President;
- The Secretariat will send to the countries the consultation for update the prioritize diseases;
- Was agreed the following dates for future meeting:
 - March 15, 2017 - 2 PM Buenos Aires Time: Electronic Meeting;
 - COSALFA 44 – April, 3 to 7, 2017, Goias - Brazil: face to face meeting.

The OIE was informed about the evaluation process of the GF-TADs that will be carried out in 2017.
