WOAH and its Observatory


One key mandate of the WOAH is to develop international standards for its Members.

These standards are recommendations for disease control, welfare management, trade...

Members are encouraged to participate in the standard-setting process and eventually adopt the standards.

But do we know if and how they implement them once adopted?

WOAH Observatory background



The adoption of the Resolution N°36 by the World Assembly of Delegates at the last General Session.

The Assembly recommends that:

"The OIE develop an Observatory to monitor the implementation of its international standards, to increase transparency and to identify constraints and difficulties faced by Members"

- Collection of information on the implementation of WOAH standards
- Identifying gaps in the implementation of WOAH standards and understanding the challenges
- Dissemination of information

Identification of capacity building needs and solutions to support Members

Enhancement of the WOAH standard setting process

Identify areas and processes that WOAH can improve internally Promoting the benefits of implementation of WOAH standards




Simulation Exercises

In 2018, WOAH carried out a one-off survey to explore whether WOAH Members had contingency plans and for which diseases/disasters. For ASF:






Since 2002, WOAH Members can voluntarily report the simulation exercises they conduct to strengthen the capacity of their Veterinary Services. For ASF:

Self-declarations


When selection ASF:

The Observatory is a new programme that provides an overview of the uptake of International Standards by WOAH Members.

What is the Observatory?

Developing international standards for animal health and welfare based on the latest scientific information lies at the heart of our mandate. Our Standards are not legally binding. Yet, when our Members vote for their adoption at the WOAH annual General Session, they commit to translating them into their national legislation.

This being said, the implementation of our Standards at country level can involve challenges, such as the lack of financial, human resources or the relevant infrastructures. As a matter of fact, the extent to which they are put into practice
