But do we know if and how they implement them once adopted?



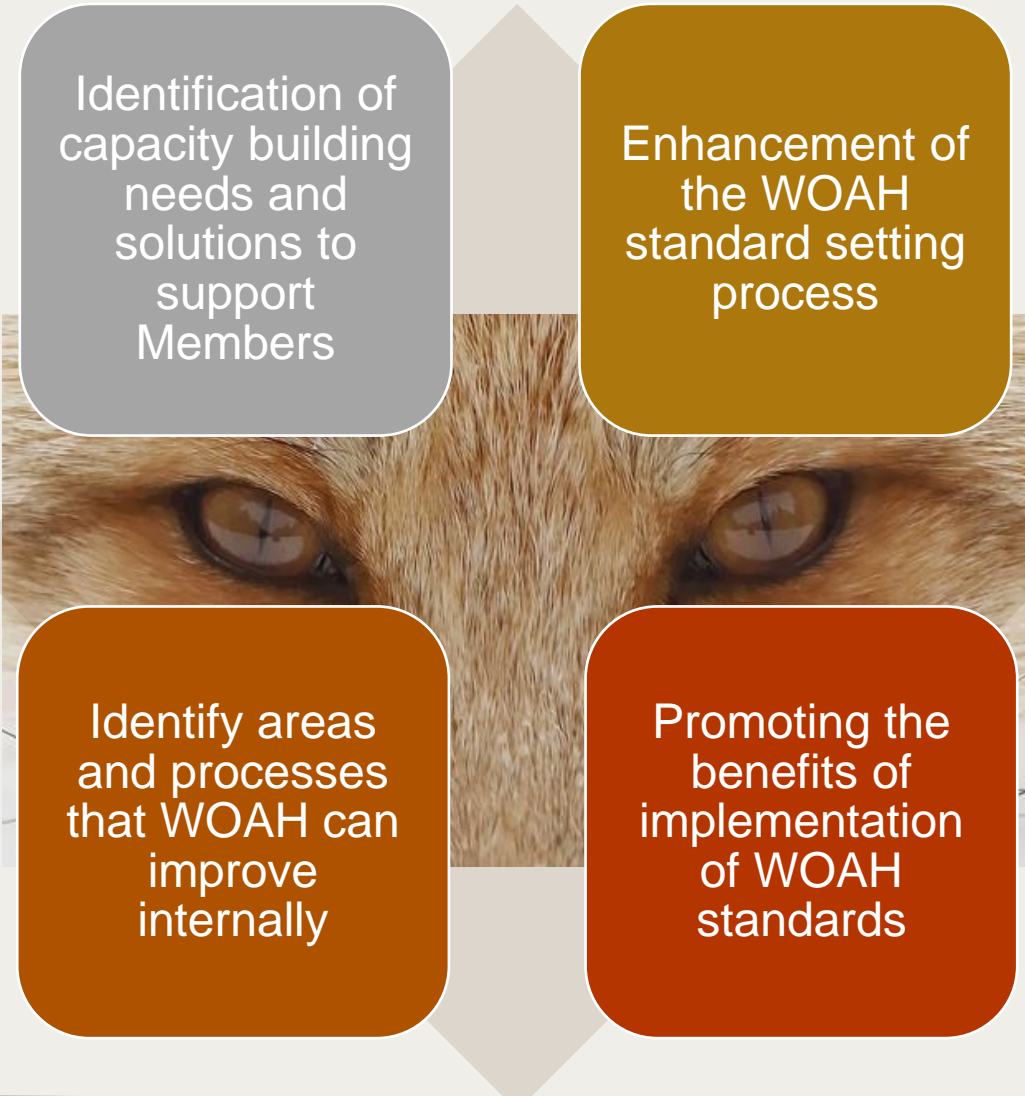
- ❑ The adoption of the **Resolution N°36** by the World Assembly of Delegates at the last General Session.

The Assembly recommends that:

“The OIE develop an Observatory to monitor the implementation of its international standards, to increase transparency and to identify constraints and difficulties faced by Members”



- Collection of information on the implementation of WOAAH standards
- Identifying gaps in the implementation of WOAAH standards and understanding the challenges
- Dissemination of information

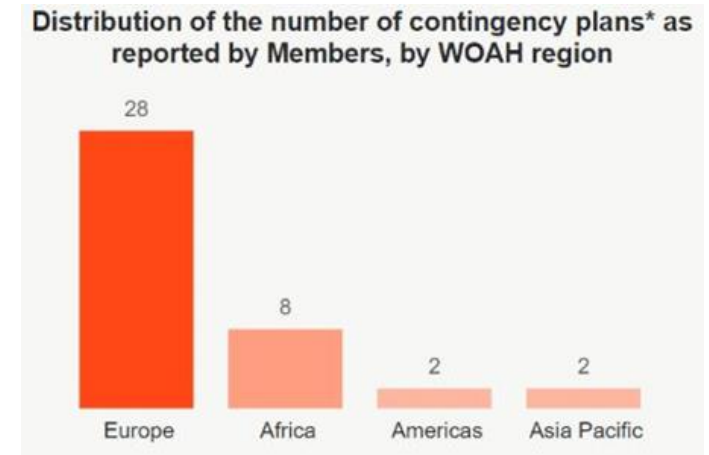

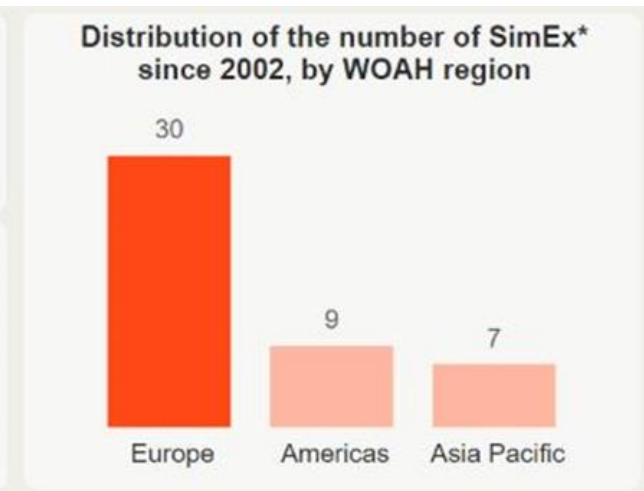

Since 2002, WOAHA Members can voluntarily report the simulation exercises they conduct to strengthen the capacity of their Veterinary Services. For ASF:

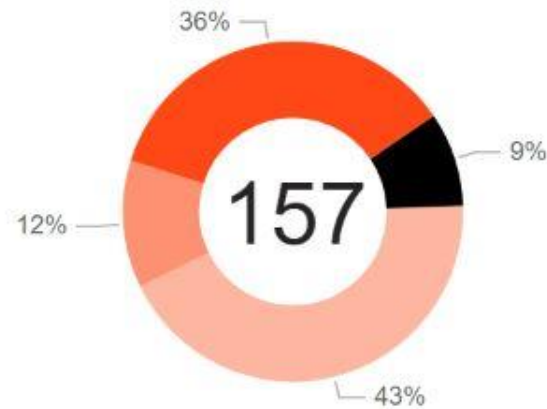




WOAH Members report control measures via WAHIS by year, semester, disease and species. Please select them carefully in the filter boxes on the left before interpreting the indicators.

When selection ASF:

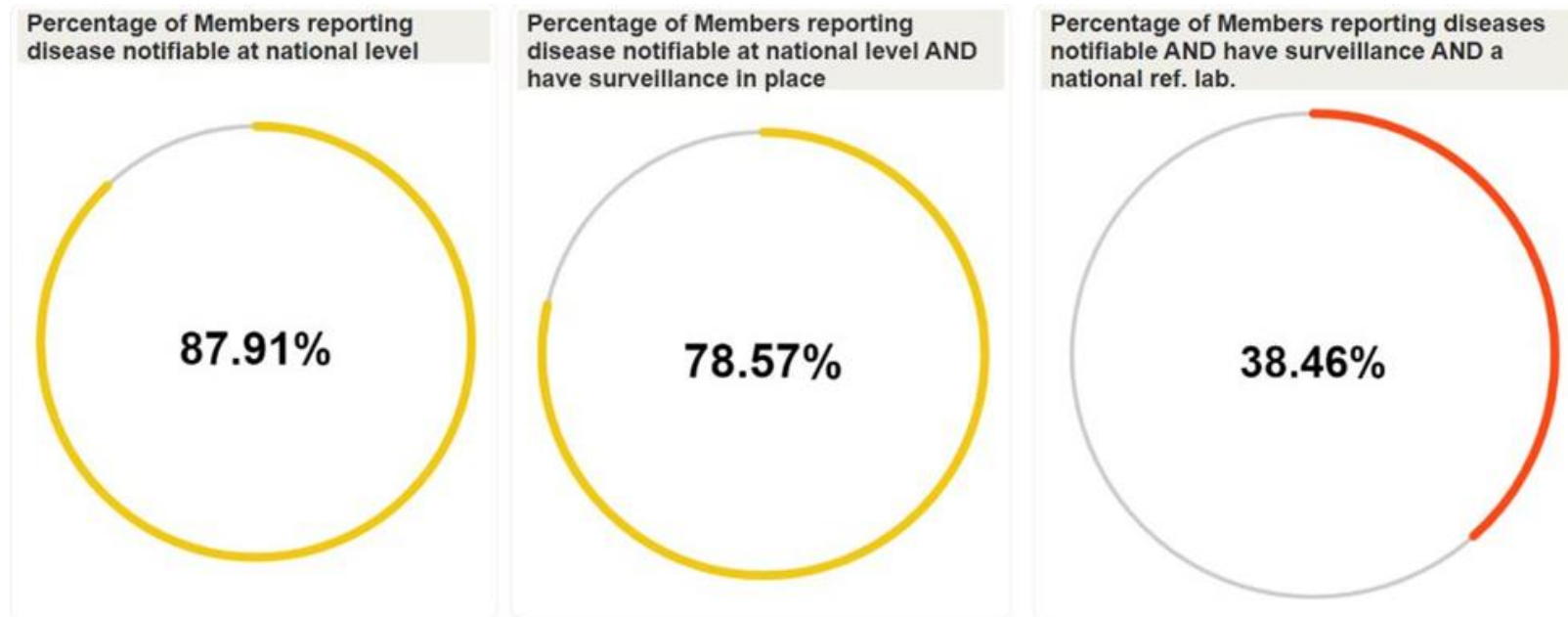
Of the 29 Members that filed a self-declaration on ASF, 9% (2 or 3 Members) were from the Americas

Developing international standards for animal health and welfare based on the latest scientific information lies at the heart of our mandate. Our Standards are not legally binding. Yet, when our Members vote for their adoption at the WOAH annual General Session, they commit to translating them into their national legislation.

This being said, the implementation of our Standards at country level can involve challenges, such as the lack of financial, human resources or the relevant infrastructures. As a matter of fact, the extent to which they are put into practice
