



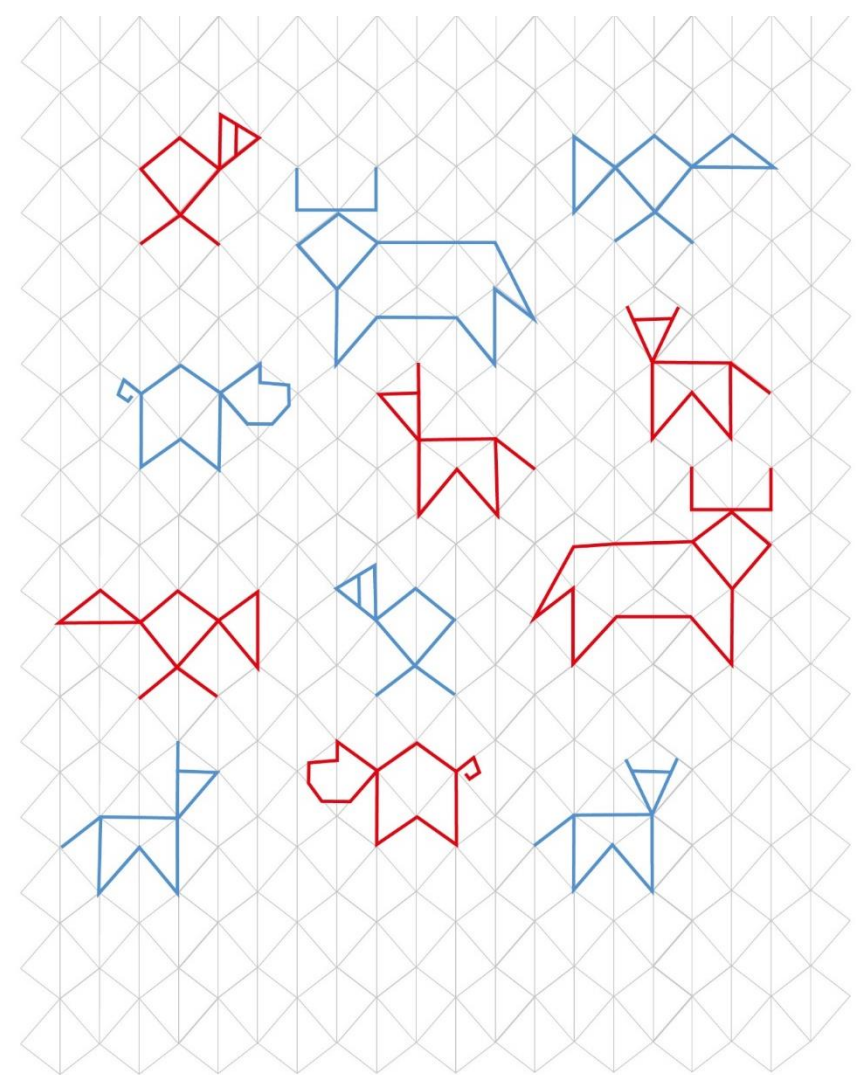

## Global Framework for the Progressive Control of Transboundary Animal Diseases (GFTADs)

Joint FAO/WOAH initiative formalized in May 2004 by the “FAO-WOAH GF-TADs general agreement”

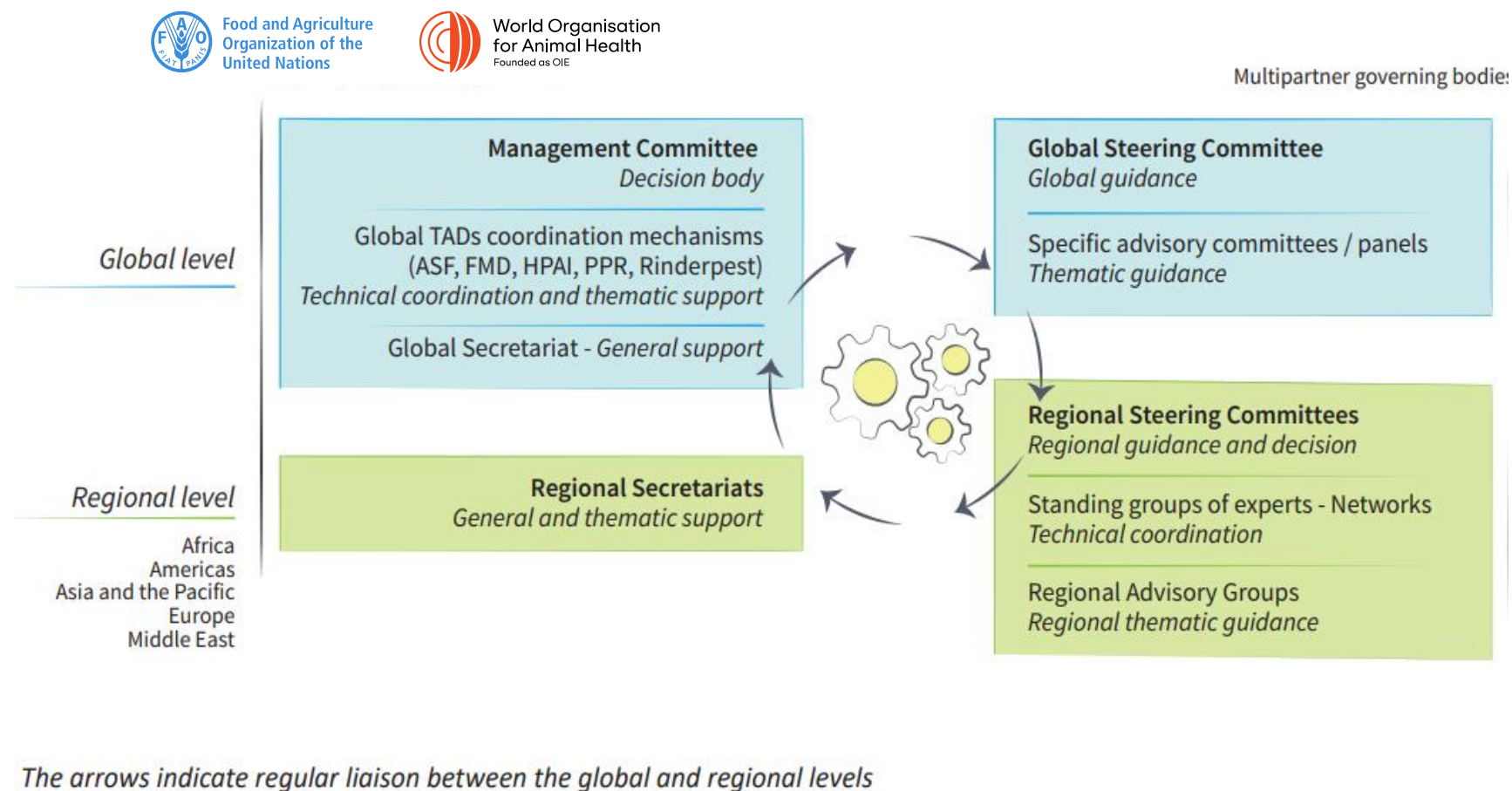
- To combine the strengths of both international organizations
- Addressing global and regional levels

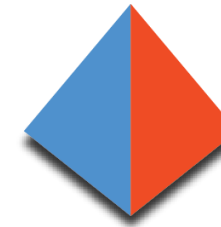
To limit the impact of animal diseases on livelihoods and international trade

- By improving prevention, detection and control
- By enhancing local and national capacity of animal health systems

## GF-TADs role and structure

- Governance for TADs control
- Working with stakeholders
- Promoting global and regional approaches
- Ensure resource availability - reducing costs, enhancing efficiency, efficacy and affordability of control measures
- Fit for purpose control measures and implementation
- Providing guidelines

## Recommendations of the 1st Meeting of the SGE-AI

### For the Countries

- Strengthen surveillance and early detection systems
- Apply strict biosecurity measures and consider preparing for eventual stamping out
- Improve the laboratory capacity
- Timely notification
- Cross-sectoral cooperation (“One Health” approach)
- Partnerships private and public sectors
- Communication campaigns





## Recommendations of the 1st Meeting of the SGE-AI

### For the international organizations

- Continue supporting high-level advocacy
- Keep coordination and collaboration, within the GF-TADs framework
- Support the improvement of national laboratory capacities
- Disseminate Risk Analysis conducted in the region
- Encourage PPP
- Coordinate training activities through the GF-TADs
- Unify and define risk and awareness communication actions

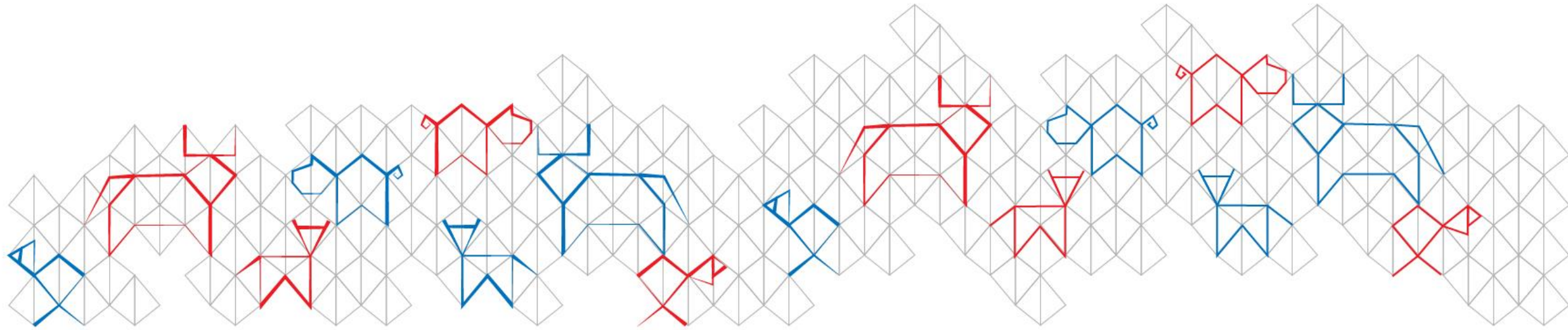


### FAO RAPID QUALITATIVE RISK ASSESSMENT
