Mission

CAMEVET is a regional project of the OIE (World Organisation for Animal Health), created to harmonise veterinary medicine registration standards among the countries of the region and OIE members through:

- Promoting approved working guidelines and applying common criteria in the region by disseminating the approved guidelines and documents of CAMEVET, highlighting their benefits.
- Harmonising guidelines and documents, including the creation of new working groups based on relevant technical topics and reviewing guidelines adopted over ten years ago.
- Disseminating CAMEVET guidelines to ensure that its objectives and the harmonisation efforts are considered in various international forums and organisations.

Vision

Throughout its history, CAMEVET has developed 30 harmonised guidelines aligned with the region's interests.

This commitment to general and regional goals remains steadfast. CAMEVET continues to strive to develop guidelines of interest among countries, considering new products and technological developments. This new Strategic Plan primarily aims to harmonise veterinary product registration standards to facilitate safe trade by developing mechanisms to establish common criteria, avoid duplication of trials, and reduce approval disparities while encouraging communication between official and private sectors.

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Actions

Internalisation:

- Disseminate the guidelines and documents approved by CAMEVET.
- Hold meetings with official sectors at the highest possible level.
- Highlight the benefits of generating and adopting harmonised guidelines and documents.

Harmonisation:

- Develop relevant technical topics.
- Form new working groups.
- Review adopted guidelines.
- Continue hosting annual CAMEVET seminars.

International Participation:

- Participate and engage organisations such as VICH, OIE, CODEX, as well as CVP, CAN, OIRSA, CAFSA, and CARICOM in CAMEVET's work..
