1st Meeting of the Standing Group of Experts on Screwworm (NWS) of GF-TADs for the Americas April 29, 2025 – Virtual Format, 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM (Panama Time)

Agenda

Background

The New World Screwworm (NWS) is a zoonotic disease of significance in the Americas, which has regained importance following the reinfestation of all Central America since October 2023.

During the 18th Meeting of the Regional Steering Committee for the Americas (RSC), held in October 2024, the establishment of a Standing Group of Experts (SGE) dedicated to the Screwworm (NWS) was agreed upon. This decision was reaffirmed in the regional meeting on the Establishment and Implementation of a New Screwworm Eradication Program, where international, regional, and subregional organizations committed to working synergistically under the GF-TADs framework.

At the 27th Conference of the Regional Commission for the Americas, held from November 25 to 29, 2024, in Quito, Ecuador, the importance of the New World Screwworm (*Cochliomyia hominivorax*) was highlighted due to its economic impact on affected countries, emphasizing not only the sanitary consequences but also the financial burden on producers, public health, and official veterinary services.

As a result, the 19th Meeting of the Regional Steering Committee for the Americas (RSC), held on March 17, 2025, approved the Terms of Reference for the Standing Group Experts on New World Screwworm (SGE-NWS) and formalized its establishment.

This first meeting marks the beginning of the activities of this Expert Group, focusing on prospective actions and interagency support to be provided in the coming years.

Objectives

- Validate the operational dynamics and coordination of the expert group.
- Analyze intervention measures to prioritize those that need further strengthening in addition to ongoing
 actions carried out by regional and national agencies.
- Promote the establishment of a coordinated action plan with short, medium, and long-term goals for both the reinfested Central American region and the historically endemic zone.
- Agree on upcoming actions and specific support to be provided by participating institutions.

Approach

The meeting will adopt a participatory, technical, and strategic approach, integrating the expertise of institutions and experts to consolidate agreements on priorities and strategies related to *Cochliomyia hominivorax*.







Expected Outcomes

- 1. Agreement on the operational framework of the Expert Group.
- 2. Consensus on prioritized intervention measures to be strengthened, complementing ongoing actions by agencies.
- 3. Outlining the foundations of a coordination plan, with goals to be further refined in a subsequent virtual meeting.
- 4. Agreement on the next meeting date (preferably virtual), and definitions regarding funding, host country, and leadership for coordination.
