Global Control of African Swine Fever: a GF-TADs Initiative

Its purpose is to:

Address strategic challenges

Promote partnerships

Strengthen prevention and preparedness measures and minimize the adverse impacts of African Swine Fever (ASF).

The GF-TADs platform makes it possible to foster regional alliances and offers opportunities for synergies with existing control strategies for *other transboundary animal diseases*.



Global Control of African Swine Fever: a GF-TADs Initiative

The Initiative provides the structure to move toward the global control of ASF.

It establishes a theory of change, translated into a logical framework, which describes the outputs and indicators according to the following three objectives:

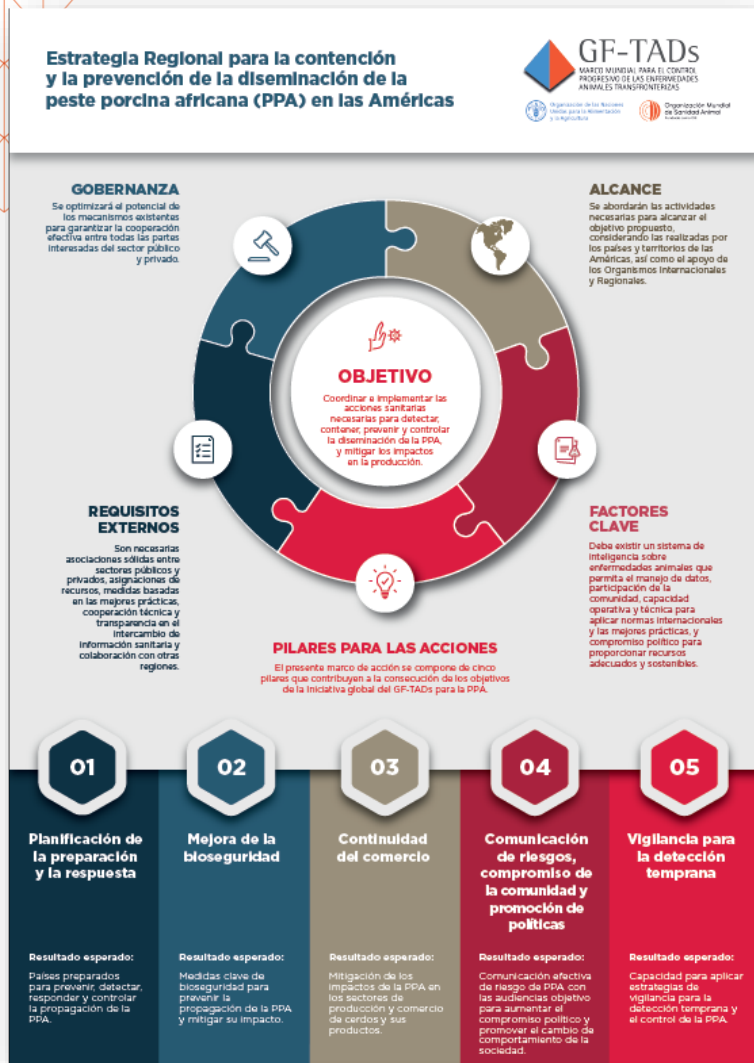
Objective 1. Improve countries' capacity to control (prevent, respond to, and eradicate) ASF by using WOAAH standards and best practices based on the most recent scientific advances.

Objective 2. Establish an effective framework for coordination and cooperation for the global control of ASF.

Objective 3. Facilitate the continuity of commercial activities.



ASF REGIONAL FRAMEWORK



OBJECTIVE

Coordinate and implement the necessary animal health actions to detect, contain, prevent, and control the spread of ASF, and to mitigate impacts on production.

PILLARS FOR ACTION

- Preparedness and response planning
- Improvement of biosecurity
- Continuity of trade
- Risk communication, community engagement, and policy advocacy
- Surveillance for early detection

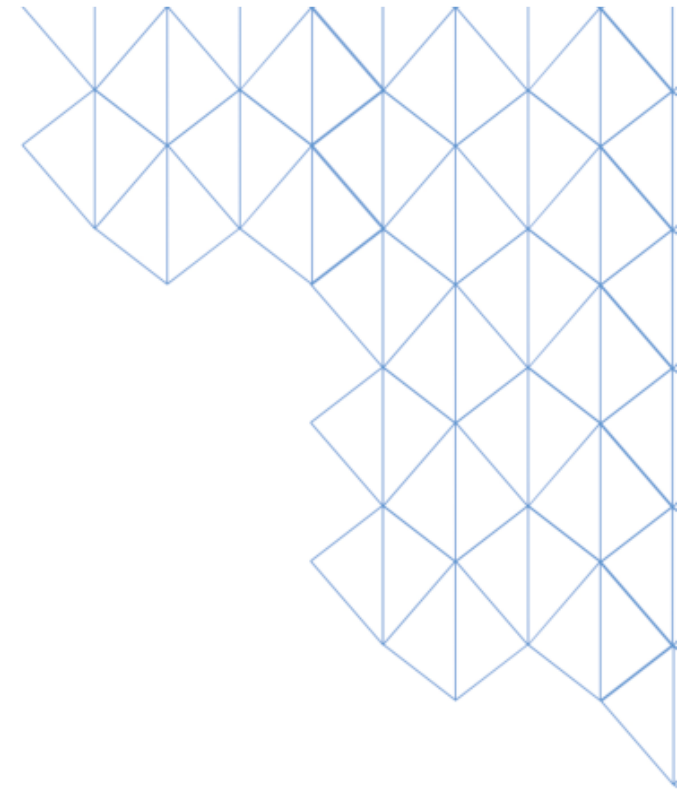
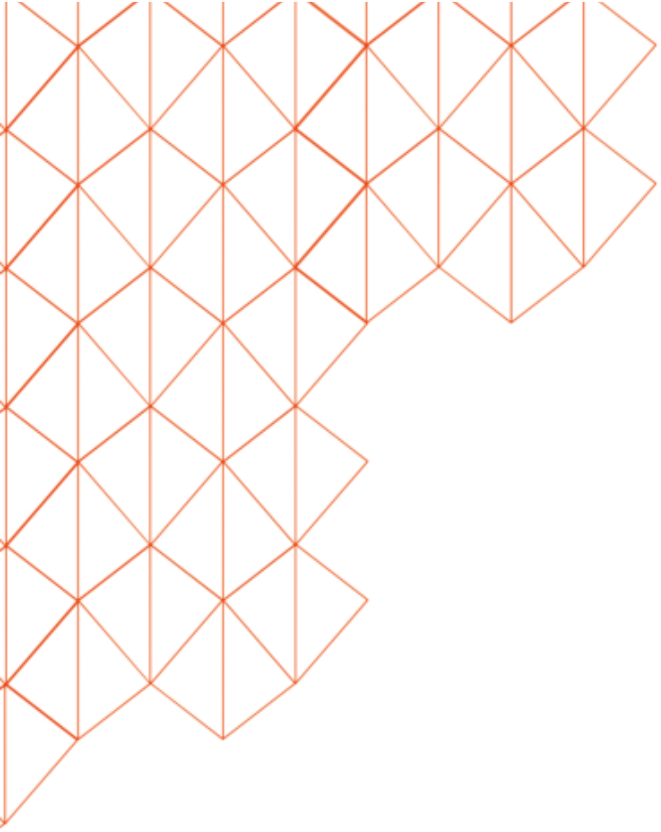
